


As Lutherans, one temptation to which we have become prone is the sin of insularity. We look at ourselves and those who believe the same as us, and we can assume that the Church *only* consists of us – of confessional Lutherans, of Missouri Synod Lutherans, or even just of members of St. Paul Lutheran Church. And yet, the Church of God is so much larger and more expansive than anything we could possibly conceive. All of those who believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior from sin, death, and the devil. All of those who have put their trust in Jesus. All of them are our brothers and sisters in Christ!

And yet, the Church of Christ – one in Christ though it remains – has become fractured and fragmented. Human sin has broken the family of God. Different beliefs about God's Word, about the Sacraments, about the office of the pastor, and so much more have led to infighting and dissention within the Body of Christ. The oneness of the Church has been stained. When we

pray for the Church of God, we pray that the unity of the Church in Heaven might come to be reflected on earth – not by sweeping these differences under the rug but by gathering together around God's Word and submitting to God's authority.

So, then, to ask a good Lutheran question: "What does this mean?" What does it mean for the Church to be one yet fractured?

In short, it means that we love and pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ, that God's Word would continue to be preached in purity and truth. That we pray for the time when all these divisions will cease and the Church's oneness in heaven will be reflected by her oneness on earth. And that we seek to work together with our fellow believers in the ways that we can. Not compromising what we believe, but seeking to further God's work on earth through acts of mercy and charity. Trusting that the Lord of the Church continues to rule and govern His Church on earth and will bring it to Himself in Heaven.

To our families with small children: Relax! You and your



children are welcome to our worship service! Being in worship with you to observe

and participate in the service will help them to learn how to behave in church – and they will learn that best by watching you worship on a regular basis! Sit anywhere in the sanctuary that you wish. The last two rows of pews are set aside for families with small children, but you don't *have* to sit there. In fact, sitting close to the front so your children can see what's happening may help them to feel more involved in the service. If they need something to keep their hands occupied, please ask one of the ushers for a copy of the children's bulletins for them to color. If for any reason you need to take your children out of the sanctuary so they can calm down, feel free to bring them into the bathroom at the back of the church. In addition, at the bottom of the stairs we have a cry room to the right, as well as the fellowship hall to the left. With the speakers in the basement, you will be able to hear the service while your child calms down. If your children don't want to sit still or be quiet through the whole service, there is absolutely nothing wrong with them: they are young and learning. The sound of children in worship is the sound of the Church's future.


